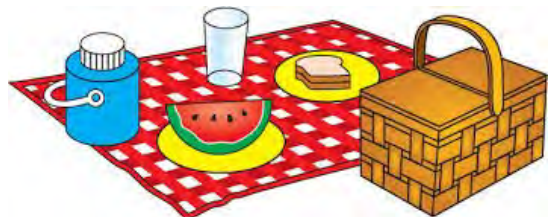

TEACHERS:

The date has been set for the “RENAISSANCE “Conference in St Simons, GA. We will be meeting Thursday MARCH 30- APRIL 2, 2017, as always with the option to stay over until Monday April 3rd.

It's that time again! It's time to be thinking about submitting paintings for the Planning Committee to review for the 2017 S.E. Conference. I know it seems early for you, but we are already well on our way to planning another fabulous event for you!

Your submission does not have to follow the event theme. We do however need your submission by August 15th. The submission form is attached for your convenience.

You may submit as many entries as you would like for no cost! Submissions are for 3 or 6 hour classes. Please keep in mind the schedule is tight and there is no wiggle room. The project needs to be completed within the 3 hour block so you may want to think 2 1/2 and 5 1/2 hours so no one is rushed. Our biggest complaint is that the projects are squeezed in and needed more time.

As a reminder to those who teach, you are paid \$75 for a 3 hour class and \$150 for a 6 hour class plus the \$15 prep fee per student for your project surface. There is more room for 3 hour classes than there is for 6 hour classes so you have a better chance for a 3 hour project to be chosen. You supply the surface for the painting and the prep work prior to the class. TEAM has limited brands of paints and colors available. You are welcome to use any and all of these paints. Should you wish to use TEAM's, please attach a list of the colors needed for your project and we will confirm the availability, otherwise you are responsible for supplying the paints for your class. Some of you have requested an inventory, however it has been decided that this is too cumbersome and may cause duplication of usage.

If you are able to do your painting in acrylic or oil, please advise your preference, and if needed, would you be willing to do it in the other medium. We are asking this due to sometimes limited submissions in a particular medium.

Keep in mind cleaners and thinners such as turpentine even odorless, for use with oil paints is not permitted in the building. Baby oil is the recommended substitute for brush cleaning in the class room.

I always try to explain brush types, uses and different strokes to classes as it broadens their knowledge and informs them what different effects one can achieve with them. How you hold the brush is key to achieving the best results. What the difference is between a bright, flat and a filbert and what types of hair in the making of them gives different affects and it helps to know how to use them. It is profitable to just take a brush and experiment with it, using different strokes, turning it different ways, tapping and holding the brush on different angles. You will be amazed of all the various affects and find that even large brushes can make beautiful foliage and details.

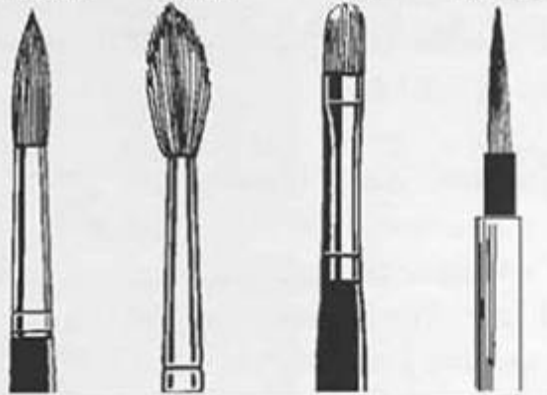
A chisel edge can achieve very fine lines and corners of the brush can make small details and dots.

A small bristle fan is very useful to make fir trees, grasses, and foliage by various strokes and tapping. As you paint, you will find that you will use favorite brushes over and over, and do not need a lot of brushes to achieve the results needed. They are like old friends and you feel lost as something is missing when you begin to paint. Treat your brushes with kindness, clean fully after each use, and they will last a long time.

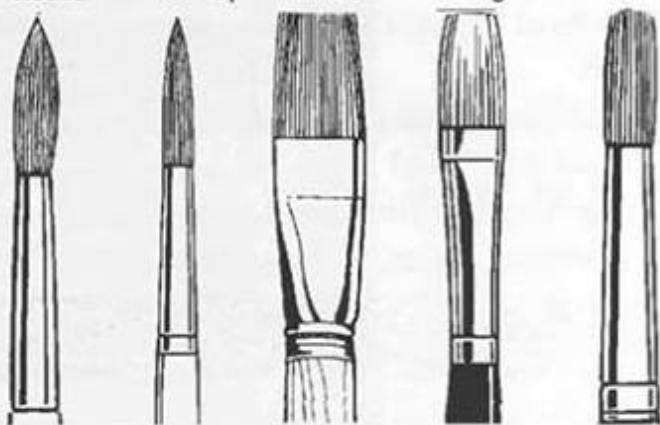


Round Pointed Round Oval Bamboo



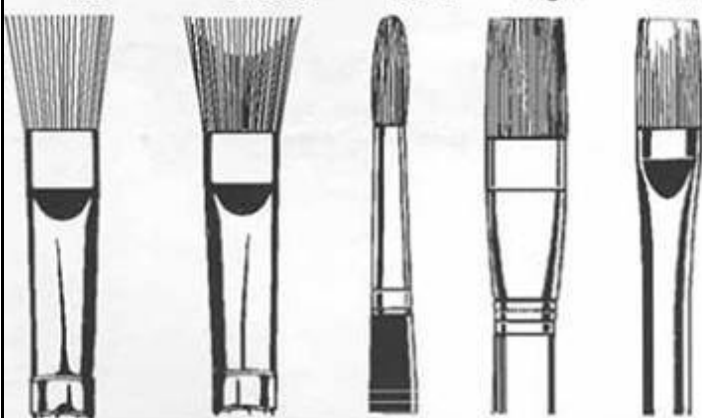
Round—Watercolor, wash, rendering, ceramics, textile, leathercraft, etc.
Round and Oval—Watercolor, wash, sky, rendering and tempera painting.
Bamboo—Watercolor, sketching, ceramics, etching.

Round* Round† Flat Bright Round**



Round*—Camel hair for easel painting, bristle for oil and easel painting.
Round†—Fine detail in oil, ceramics, textile, etc.
Flat—Smooth textural effects in oil, ceramics, textile, etc.
Bright—Textured brush effects in oil painting, ceramics, textile.
Round**—For sketching, wash and detail painting with acrylic medium.

Flat—Easel painting and oil painting.
Flat Chiseled—Easel painting in powdered tempera and other mediums.
Round—Camel hair for easel painting, bristle for oil and easel painting.
Bright—Textured effects in oil painting, ceramics, textile.
Long Flat—Flexible brush stroke technique in oil painting.
